This top-level forum, co-organized by the World Tourism Organization (WTO) and the Basque Culinary Center from October 5 to 7 in San Sebastián (Spain) The event brought together over 500 participants from all over the world, including institutional representatives, tourism professionals and media specializing in gastronomic tourism.

The Secretary General of the <u>World Tourism Organization</u>, Zurab Pololikashvili, underlined the richness of the African continent, with particular emphasis on the Mediterranean, and the UNWTO's interest in developing more intensive collaboration in this field.
